



#### Issue


- No money may be spent without Parliament's consent.
- How should parliamentarians provide informed consent of proposed spending?



# **Limited Progress**

While the number of committee reports on Estimates has grown, the share of Committee meetings devoted to their review has fallen – down by over half since the mid-1990s.

In 2009 and 2010, less than 100 hours spent on the Estimates.




### What Could Be Done?

- 1. Build on *lessons* learned from other Westminster jurisdictions
- 2. Set standard for *informed consent* by Committees
- 3. Improve *transparency* of Executive branch financial data

### **Westminster Practices**

OECD BEST PRACTICES	Westminster Jurisdictions	Canada
Proposed plan presented to legislatures at least 3 months before start of fiscal year	Few	No
Proposed plan approved before start of fiscal year	Many	No
Non-financial performance data presented for all expenditure programs (e.g. program activity architecture)	Few	Yes
