

Cost Estimate of Election Campaign Proposal

Short Title: Pharmacare

Description: Introducing a drug plan with universal coverage that will cover the total cost of expenditures

> on drugs listed on Quebec's public drug plan formulary. The federal government will pay for costs incremental to spending by provincial governments on drugs on the formulary and to

existing direct federal spending. This proposal will be effective October 1, 2022.

- · Estimates are presented on an accrual basis as would appear in the budget and public
- · A positive number implies a reduction in the budgetary balance (lower revenues or higher spending). A negative number implies an increase in the budgetary balance (higher revenues or lower spending).
- · "-" = PBO does not expect a financial cost.

Estimation and projection method: PBO estimated and projected the cost based on the same data sources and methodology as used in previous costings with some modifications. Adjustments were made to include OHIP+. The Medical Expense Tax Credit and the tax expenditure of Private Health Benefits Deduction were updated. Estimates were projected using the latest information available from various sources including the Patented Medicine Prices Review Board (PMPRB) and Finance Canada's Report on Federal Tax Expenditures. Provincial drug program spending and federal savings were subtracted from the gross cost of the proposal.

Source of Uncertainty: The main sources of uncertainty relate to the assumed growth rates of various cost drivers and the use of Quebec's 2016 formulary, as well as the assumed confidential rebate rate.
