

## **Cost Estimate of Election Campaign Proposal**

Publication Date: September 2021

Short Title: Financial support for deeply affordable non-market, co-op and non-profit housing

Description: Providing financial support for the construction or acquisition of deeply affordable non-

market, co-op and non-profit housing. Capital contributions for 30,000 units annually will be provided in the form of interest-free 20-year loans. Rent subsidies will be provided equal to the difference between 25% of household income and market median rent for an adequate

and suitable housing in the local area. This proposal will be effective January 1, 2022.

Notes:

- · Estimates are presented on an accrual basis as would appear in the budget and public accounts.
- · A positive number implies a reduction in the budgetary balance (lower revenues or higher spending). A negative number implies an increase in the budgetary balance (higher revenues or lower spending).
- $\cdot$  "-" = PBO does not expect a financial cost.

Estimation and projection method:

Average construction costs for National Housing Co-Investment Funding projects were indexed for rising costs. The carrying cost of incremental debt was calculated using the PBO Public Debt Charge Calculator. The average subsidy that would be paid was estimated based on the higher end (75<sup>th</sup> percentile) of subsides that would be required for renter households spending more than 25% of their income on rent.

Source of Uncertainty:

The main sources of uncertainty relate to the incomes of eligible households and to future .

interest rates.
